Oregon's senior U.S. Senator Ron Wyden is adding Josephine County's town hall to his list of deferred public listening sessions this month.

Today his office said, "Due to ongoing negotiations in the U.S. Senate, Senator Wyden has to postpone his town hall in Josephine County, which was scheduled on Feb. 12 at 3:30 p.m. at Rogue Community College Redwood Campus in Grants Pass."

Senator Wyden said, "I made a promise to Oregonians that I would come to every county every year to listen to you about issues that affect your county and region. I also made a promise to work hard on your behalf in DC and stay as long as it takes to get the work done. I look forward to finding new dates for these town halls and hearing from folks in Josephine County."

Wyden's Polk, Lincoln, Tillamook and Clatsop County Town Halls scheduled for February 9-11 also were postponed and will be rescheduled as soon as time permits.
